

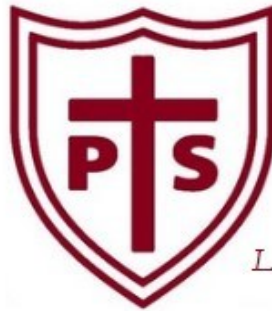

## Our Curriculum in Action

### Nursery

Acorns had an amazing time celebrating Careers Day. The children were full of curiosity and enthusiasm as we welcomed visitors to talk about their jobs. We listened to a fascinating range of talks, learning a little bit about HR, Geology, Journalism, and Banking. The children asked thoughtful questions, shared



their own ideas, and were wonderfully engaged throughout. To make the morning even more special, we finished with a very exciting surprise - a ride on the fire engine! The children loved exploring the equipment, meeting the firefighters, and hearing the siren.

### Reception

In Reception, we have had a fantastic and exciting start to our new theme, "Paws, Jaws and Claws!" The classroom has been full of curiosity, care and excitement as we welcomed some very special animal visitors. We were thrilled to spend time with Fejj, the school therapy tortoise. The children carefully used their fine motor skills to grate carrots and chop lettuce to make her a delicious snack, and they even helped give her a gentle bath, making sure to handle her with great care. We have had a wonderful visit from Mia the dog, who was beautifully behaved. The children loved learning about how to look after a pet and discussed what an important responsibility it is. Later in the week, we met Thunder the rabbit who was a little shy but the children were so calm, quiet and welcoming

that she soon felt confident enough to hop out of her carrier to say hello. It has been a brilliant start to our theme, and we are so proud of the kindness, enthusiasm and curiosity the children have shown while learning about pets and how to care for them.



### Year 1
