The positive response over the past two days has been encouraging, and we appreciate your continued support in making this a success for everyone.

A quick reminder, too, that today is the final opportunity to order PE hoodies for delivery before the summer holidays.

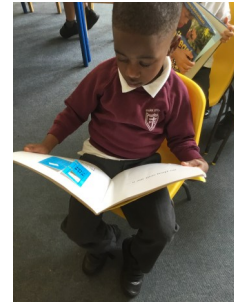

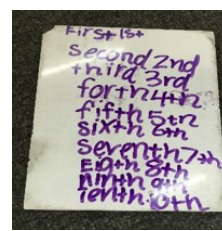
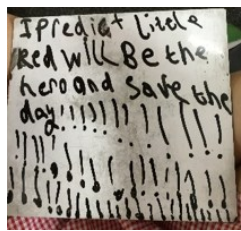
Reception

Year 1

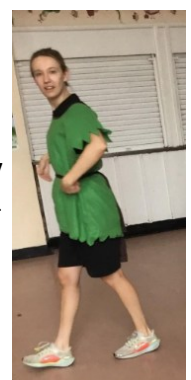

lots of fun when we launched our new topic, 'The Great British Forecast' making wind streamers and playing with them outside.

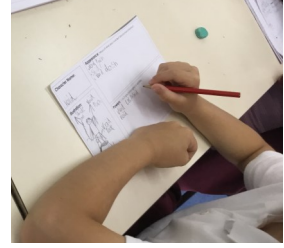
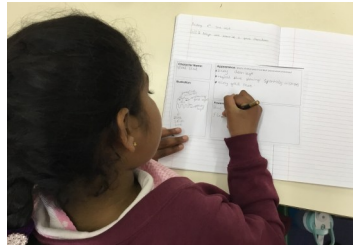
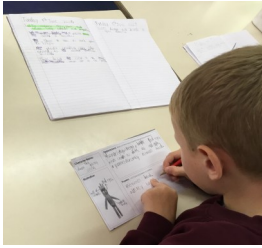
Year 2

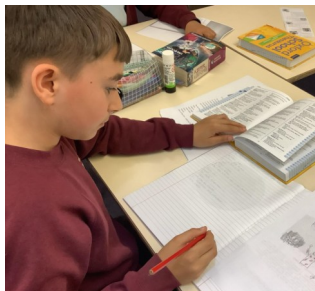
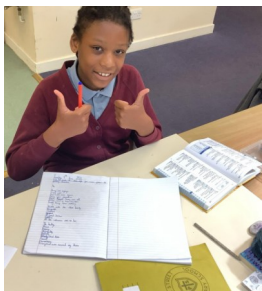


Year 4
