'The Great British Forecast'

Geography



In Geography this half term we will be answering the question, 'What is the weather like in the UK?'. We will be learning to identify and locate the four UK countries, recognise our own country and describe location using basic compass directions. We will also measure different types of weather, using symbols used in weather forecasts, describe seasonal changes and suggest appropriate clothing and activities for each season.

Number and place value – Place value up to 100. Learning the place value of ones, tens, and hundreds

Telling the Time- O'clock and Half Past
Money – recognizing coins and notes & counting in coins

'Reflect, rewind and replay' is our theme for music this half term.

Key vocabulary

Season- a quarter of the year that has different weather to other parts of the year.

Weather- the description of what the conditions are like in a place.

Spring – the season when the weather starts to warm.

Summer- the warmest season of the year.

Autumn – the season when the warm weather starts to get colder.

Winter- The coldest season of the year.

Daylight- the natural light there is during the day.

Rainfall- is all the water that falls on an area.

Map is a useful tool to help us find our way around and show where different places are in relation to each other.

Weather Forecast-A weather forecast is a smart guess about what the weather will be like soon

United Kingdom- The United Kingdom is a country made up of four parts: England, Scotland, Wales, and Northern Ireland. People often call it the UK.

Atlas- An atlas is a book full of maps that helps people learn about countries, cities, oceans, and the world.

Reading objectives:

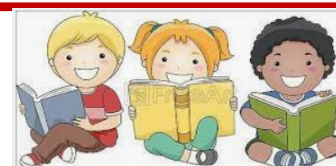
1. To use pictures as reading clues and to help with understanding

Reading Books

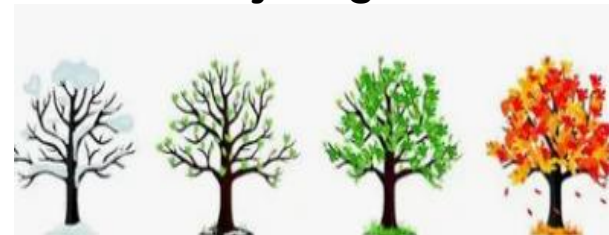

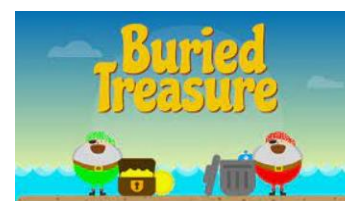
