Our Curriculum in Action

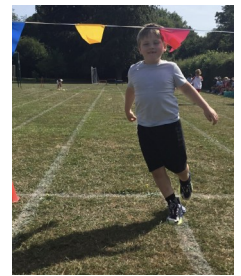
Nursery

They have made salt dough tiles with concentric circles pressed in, a large-scale fabric weaving; they have cut, arranged and glued concentric circles, as well as making tissue paper papier mache lanterns and they have all painted a square with concentric circles as part of a whole school collaborative display.

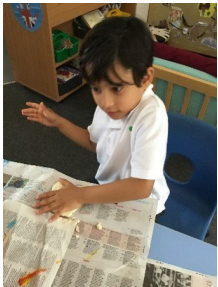


Reception

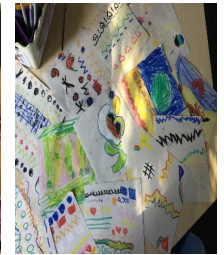

This week, Year 2 have enjoyed a fantastic Art Week inspired by the work of Wassily Kandinsky. Throughout the week, the children explored a range of artistic techniques and materials, including chalk, watercolours, coloured paper collages and acrylic paints. They also took part in a special Art Festival Day, where



they created concentric circles in many different and creative ways. Our Forest School session was a particular highlight, with the children taking part in exciting activities such as 'Kicking Kandinsky' and 'Rolling Kandinsky', bringing art and outdoor learning together in a fun and memorable way. To finish the week, the children proudly tied their own concentric fabric wheels. It has been a wonderful week filled with creativity, enthusiasm and artistic exploration!

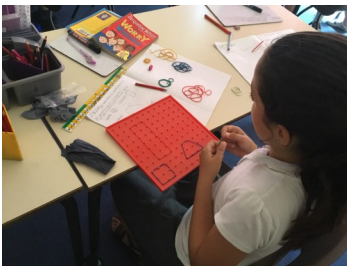
Year 3

Year 4

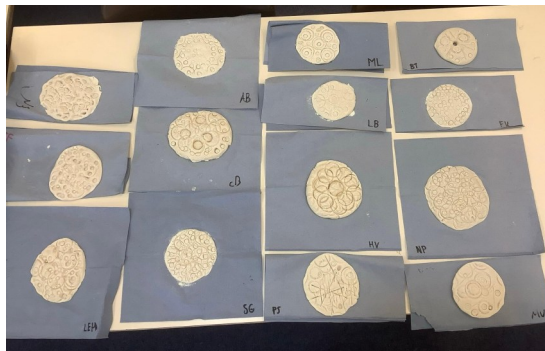

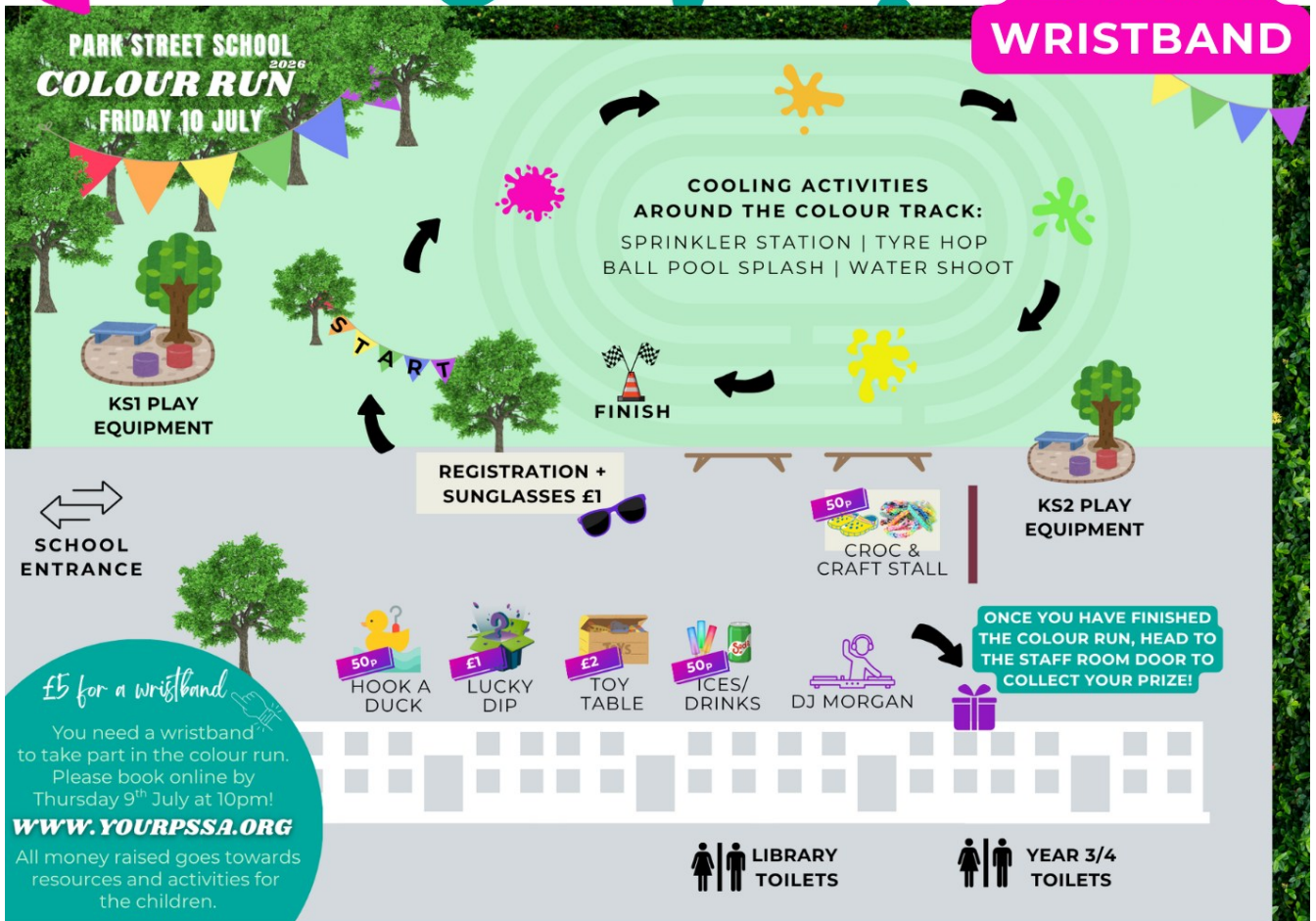
