Absence procedures

Attendance at school is extremely important and there is a proven connection between success at school and high attendance. However, we understand that there will be occasions when children are unwell.

If your child is too unwell to attend school, please inform the office as soon as possible (ideally before 9:30am) You can report an absence by calling the office (01727872158) and **pressing option 1**, or sending an email to absence@parkstreet.herts.sch.uk

If we do not hear from you, we will:

- 1. Make a phone call to the main contact numbers to ascertain a reason for absence.
- 2. If there is no response after multiple tries, you may receive a home visit from a member of staff and/or we may need to consider seeking advice from Children's Social Care.

These procedures are to ensure that we know where your child is and that you are all safe.

Medical Information Update


Could we ask parents/carers to update the school with any changes to their children's medical needs. It is important for the school to keep up-to-date medical records. Thank you.

Free School Meals

Children in year 3 or older

Your child can get a free school meal if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (as long as you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you don't get more than £16,190 a year)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (with annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax and not including any benefits you get).

Apply today if you receive any of these benefits. It takes **5 mins** and in most cases we can tell you straightaway if your child can get free meals at school.
