We are at the end of the first half term of this academic year and, as

always, lots of wonderful learning has taken place. Pine class have really enjoyed their 'Sensational South America' topic this half term. They made empanadas in DT last week (they looked delicious!) and this week completed their non-chronological reports on the Amazon rainforest! Many year groups have also enjoyed their Forest



School sessions; building dens, cooking in the mud kitchen and swinging on the rope swing!

Last year, one of our targets was to continue to ensure the school's reading culture enables pupils to become confident, keen and capable readers. We are proud to share that 79% of children in Reception achieved age related expectations in word reading, 90% passed the phonics screening check in Year 1 and 86% of KS2 children achieved age related expectations—well above national expectations. We are pleased that we are able to provide children with numerous opportunities to thrive both academically and personally at Park Street and look forward to continuing to do so.

This week, parent teacher consultations have been held. We hope that the discussions about your children's learning and progress during the consultations were useful. Please remember that if you have any queries, you can always contact your child's class teacher or the school office.


Year 4






Secondary School Applications
