R.E



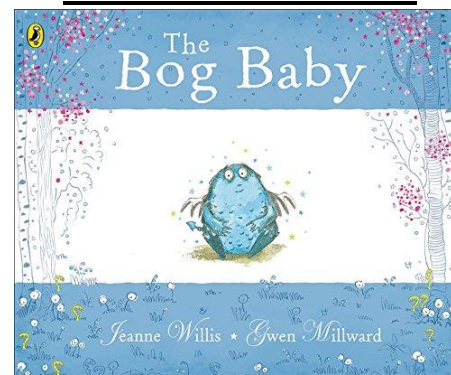
In R.E, we will be learning that Christians believe that God created the universe and humans should care for the world because it belongs to God.

So many hearts make a school.

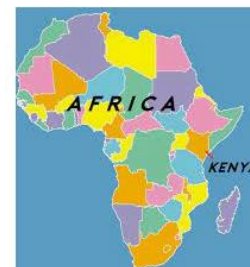


Lead Texts
