Governors' Report to Parents

The Governors spent a stimulating day in school on Tuesday 14th November. The principal purpose of the day was to review progress on writing as this is a key focus for the school this year, building on the excellent progress which has already been made on reading.

Governors visited each year group during a writing lesson and were pleased to note that pupils' work provided clear evidence of the progress which has been made.

During the day, Governors also took the opportunity to meet a group of pupils from a range of school years. This is what Governors normally refer to as 'Pupil Voice'. The pupils spoke enthusiastically about their experiences of writing and also about various aspects of their well-being. It was encouraging to see how pupils wanted to show their work and to demonstrate what they have been able to achieve.

Walking round the classrooms, Governors were able to look at displays which included some examples of work done by pupils.

Conversations were held with several members of staff, both teaching and support staff, about their own well -being. It was most encouraging to hear how they feel well supported by the senior management. They described their experiences of resources management and time management, and expressed appreciation of how external resources are used to broaden their own 'tool set'. Several spoke warmly about the family feel of the school.

The day concluded with a review of writing books from several year groups. Governors were reassured that what is being taught is giving rise to ever-improving outcomes for pupils.

As always, the Governors were grateful to Ms Gregory, the staff and the pupils for the warm welcome which they received.

Year 4






Year 5/6
