Our School Prayer

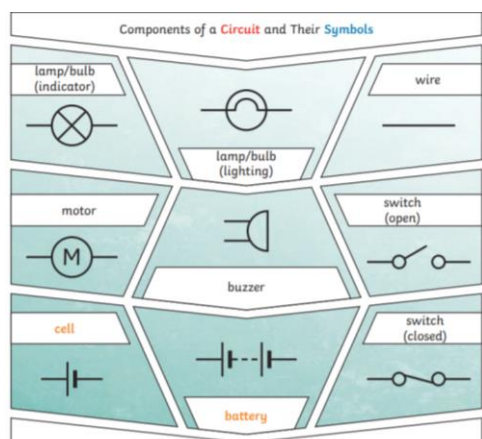
This is our school,

 So many hearts make a school.



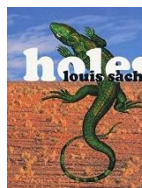
Science – Electricity

We will be learning to:

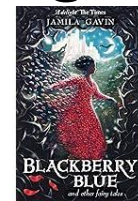
- associate the brightness of a lamp or the volume of a buzzer with the number and voltage of cells used in the circuit

- use recognised symbols when representing a simple circuit in a diagram



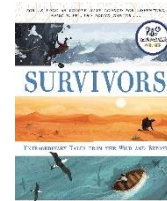

Has the way we catch and punish criminals improved in the last 100 years?

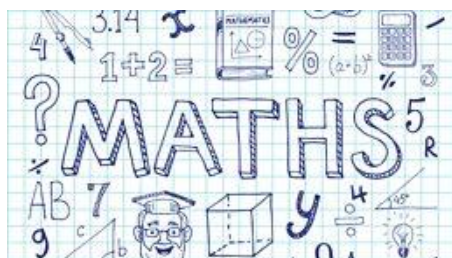
We will be learning about:
