Key achievements to date until July 2019:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We have run a wide range of different sports clubs and activities for all ages. We will have run 13 different clubs this year. 61% of children in YR –Y6 have attended a sports club this year. 68% of children in KS2 took part in an inter-school competition We have entered 10 Level 2 competitions. We run Level 1 inter-house competitions for all children in KS2. Sport is an important part of school life and is celebrated in assemblies and reported in the fortnightly newsletter. Last year we achieved the Sainsbury’s School Games Gold Award for the second time. We have active lessons, brain breaks and are working towards 30:30. All children continue to take part in the Daily Mile and wheelie Wednesday We were successful in several competitions and tournaments throughout the year. We won the St Albans and District netball league and came runners up in the District tournament. Our Y6 cross country team won the overall St Albans and District small schools trophy and our girls team were the best small schools cross country team in the district. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To continue to ensure that there are equal opportunities for all pupils across the school. Increase the number of children engaging in PA. Continue to provide support for staff to ensure they feel confident in delivering sessions. Provide opportunities for children to take part in competitions including those who do not regularly take part. There has been an overall decrease in the percentage of children attending sports clubs – down by 13% from last year.
